We are "Proud" to present the 111h Annual Pathways2Possibilities:P2P Gulf Coast Career Expo 2024. P2P will take place again this year at the Mississippi Coast Convention Center, on Wednesday and Thursday, November 20th & 21st 2024. We have confirmation that 7,079 students will be in attendance.

All eighth graders from public and private schools plus homeschooled students will attend P2P from the six lower coastal counties: Hancock, Harrison, George, Jackson, Pearl River, and Stone plus, to the north, Forrest, Greene, Jones, and Perry counties. As eighth graders depart the expo, older Opportunity Youth ages 16-24 will experience P2P.

We will feature nineteen career clusters/pathways aligned with the US and Mississippi Departments of Education. Each student will spend 90 minutes on the convention floor, exploring their career interests. Professionals from a variety of businesses, industries and organizations will engage and educate students by highlighting high demand jobs and careers through custom designed handson activities in their respective fields. They will also share what their jobs/careers entail, and the education and training required, to attain the same or similar roles.

You will see our 2024 student booklet online at our website www.pathways2possibilities.org We highly recommend that you take time to review the booklet with your student. A page is dedicated to each career pathway that lists jobs and careers within each professional field and expected salary ranges.

We recognize that each student learns differently and possesses different abilities and skills. It is our goal to introduce them to the wide variety of options they may consider earlier so that they are better informed to make great future education and career choices. Students will also learn what careers are available to them in their home communities, across the great state of Mississippi and beyond. We want students to see the relevance between what they are learning in the classroom and how that relates to their future education and career plans thus entering and staying in high school and graduating.

Since P2P started on the Mississippi Gulf Coast in 2013 we have hosted over 125,000 Mississippi students.
